HEALING OF TRIGEMINAL NEURALGIA

My name is George Moshen. I am a convert to Orthodoxy from Judaism (baptized by Fr. Konstantine Tsigas in 1987).

During the summer of 2004, I experienced a very painful bout of trigeminal neuralgia. I had seen a neurologist in New Jersey, and she prescribed oxycodone (a strong narcotic pain killer). It didn't work as well as plain old Advil.

The pain was excruciating as I pulled myself together to make the 100 mile trip from New Jersey to Saint Nektarios Monastery. After meeting with one of the monks, I was given oil from the lamp of Agios Nektarios.

I prayed and applied the oil in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.

While driving down Route 17, I experienced my body heating to the point of steaming. By the time I reached Monticello, the pain was gone.

I have not experienced this pain again. I have not had to visit the neurologist since my visit to Saint Nektarios. I praise my blessed Saint and I thank God for His healing.
